Public Hearing to Consider Support for Renewal Petition

On June 28th, 2024, St. Hope Public School 7 submitted a petition to renew its charter. It is requesting to renew the term of its charter, which expires on June 30, 2025. Today's public hearing is the first public hearing on the St. Hope Public School 7 renewal petition, as required by Education Code. The purpose of the public hearing is to consider the support for the charter petition from the district's teachers, other employees, and parents.

Staff are currently reviewing the submitted petition. Following the review of the petition and this public hearing, the governing board of the school district shall either grant or deny the charter within 90 days of receipt of the petition. That decision is scheduled to occur at the September 19, 2024, board meeting. The governing board of the school district shall publish all staff recommendations, including the recommended findings, at least 15 days before the public hearing at which the governing board of the school district will either grant or deny the charter. Staff is scheduled to publish this report by September 4, 2024.

The school leaders will be given the remainder of this agenda item to present to the Board, with public comment and Board discussion to follow.


- PS7 opened in the 2003-04 school year with grades K-4; we now serve scholars in grades TK-8.
- The school was initially authorized by SCUSD in 2002 and is in its 22nd year of operation as a charter school. This is PS7's fourth charter renewal.
- PS7's academic program includes significant additional time for all students above the state's minimum instructional minutes.
- Scholars who attend PS7 from TK through 8th grade receive almost three additional years of school with this extra time.
- We are renovating our Elementary School on Strawberry Lane a historic \$35 million investment is transforming the campus located in a traditionally-underserved community.



PS7's English Learners are outperforming their peers in the District and the state.

In 2023-24, families self identified as homeless increased dramatically to more than 10% of total enrollment at PS7. On the most recent ELA CAASPP exams, this group of scholars showed strong performance.

State-of-the-Art Elementary School Campus

We have completely transformed our Elementary school campus located on Strawberry Lane in the southern portion of Oak Park. This is a SCUSD property being renovated and expanded with state funding that is only available to charter schools. Our historic \$35 million investment includes:

- 31 brand new classrooms
- Renovated multi-purpose room and kitchen
- New administration building
- Reconfigured front entrance, accessways, and parking area
- New hardscape, landscaping, playground, fields, and basketball courts

- Providing significant professional development opportunities - teachers at PS7 receive 21 full days of professional development over the course of a school year
