#### **Student Identification**

- Summer Matters programs will be open to **ALL current TK current 12th grade** students enrolled in SCUSD
  - Elementary: Current TK- Current 5
  - o MS: Current 6 Current 7
  - HS: Current 8 Current 12
- Site Designed Academic Program (SDAP):
  - o Sites/Departments will submit a proposal and students will be pre-identified by site using various data points
  - o Sites/Departments must run their program in accordance with the summer school start and end times
  - Site/Departments must run their SDAP at an existing identified summer school site if they are not on the initial list of approved summer school site due to staffing shortages during the summer months
  - o High School Sites will need to complete their by March 30th
  - SDAP LINK: SITE DESIGNED ACADEMIC PROGRAM PROPOSAL
  - o Send your SDAP link to Neng-Her@scusd.edu
- Credit Recovery (CR) open to all HS students
  - High School Students are <u>identified by counselors</u> and encouraged to participate in online credit recovery and in-person options to meet graduation and A-G requirements
    - Priority is given to credit deficient seniors
- ESY students are determined through the IEP process

#### **Summer School Enrollment**

- Summer Matters online applications will officially open from April 1 April 30 for the Summer Matters programs for TK-8
  - Expanded Learning Providers will help parents enroll for summer school at the site
- High School and Site Designed Academic Programs are actively pre-identifying students through their counselors and support services teams to enroll students
- ESY students are all identified through the IEP process -- SPED team at each site will submit eligible students to the ESY Team to ensure the students' IEP direct services are in place during the ESY program timeline
