In 2025, one or more scholarships of at least \$1,000 will be awarded. In 2024, six scholarships of \$2,525 each were awarded.

ELIGIBILITY:

Graduating McClatchy seniors who will attend a two-year or a four-year college or university in the fall of 2025 are eligible. Applicants should have:

- 3.0 or higher GPA
- Commitment to continuing his or her education
- Financial need

APPLICATION PROCESS:

The application process requires:

- Completing the Application Form, which includes answering questions designed to help us get to know you and to understand: what you plan to study in college and why; what your career goals are; what school and outside interests and activities you have participated in; what volunteer and/or paid work experience you have; what your family/home responsibilities are; and why it is financially important for you to receive a scholarship
- Providing an unofficial transcript including grades from the first semester of your senior year of high school
- Providing two letters of recommendation

DUE DATE:

April 4, 2025

SELECTION PROCESS:

The Class of '66 Scholarship Selection Committee will evaluate all applications. GPA is only one of several factors that the Committee members will consider when selecting Scholarship recipients. Other factors Committee members will consider include: the applicant's need for the Scholarship; their willingness to set, and passionately pursue, challenging personal goals; their perseverance in overcoming obstacles; their ability to learn from, and to bounce back from setbacks; and their concern for the welfare of others. The Committee may elect to have telephone, virtual, or in-person interviews with applicants.
